I hope everyone had a happy and warm Christmas and New Year! It's hard to believe that 2025 is over and we're into the new year! 2025 was quite a year, and I wanted to highlight a few of the many wonderful things that have happened.

We started off the year with the Consecration Anniversary Service, recreating and adapting the original order of worship used for the consecration of the sanctuary in 1965. Despite the cold winter weather, we had a great turnout, enjoyed a wonder chicken potluck dinner together, and also dedicated the new sanctuary organ with a blessing and a recital.

In April, we had our annual Palm Sunday cantata, dedicated in loving memory to Helen Gregg, who created stunning visual media and creative camerawork for the cantata for many years before her passing.

We continue to enjoy the time and talents of our worship band at the 9:50 worship service, led by Stuart Eshleman. If you haven't heard the full ensemble rock out, stop by the 9:50 service sometime - you won't be disappointed!

During the summer, we turned our focus to Vacation Bible School, where music plays an important and fun role. There is nothing like cranking the sound system up to 11 and hearing all the people (both big and little) sing and dance their hearts out to songs like "On the Road with God", "Manna in the Morning", and "Even When the Lions Roar." It warms my heart to see everyone singing and dancing together.

The fall kicked off with the Folk Choir and Chancel Choir beginning rehearsal for their musical offerings, and we started two new ensembles! The Handbells and the Children's Choir. Currently, the bells and the children's choir are seasonal, lining up with Christmas and Easter this first year. We just finished up the Christmas Cantata and Christmas Pageant in early December - what incredibly moving services! I'm always amazed about how the community comes together to offer some really important worship to the area.

I am incredibly blessed to work here at Trinity – I'm in the middle of my sixth year on the church staff. I couldn't do this work without the faithful volunteers from the congregation that make it all happen. Trinity is such a special place - we have over 100 people involved in the choirs, orchestra, band, handbells, and children's choir. There are also people who have volunteered to sing or run tech for funerals, which is a vital service to the families we serve. I also need to mention the behind-the-scenes people – our music librarians and tech booth volunteers! None of this would happen without all of you. Thank you for offering your time, talents, and treasures to the church. Thank you all from the bottom of my heart.







Bible Study, What Would Jesus DeConstruct led by Pastor Eric

John Caputo wants nothing less than to confront us with a Jesus who resists all our domestications. In and through humor that will have you laughing out loud, Caputo is dead serious. Here is a book in the tradition of John the Baptist, out to make way for a Messiah who, when he shows up, will ruin all our parties. And so Caputo invites us to ask: What would happen if Jesus showed up in Colorado Springs? Or slowly made his way down the aisle on "Justice Sunday" in Kansas? What would Jesus deconstruct if he made an appearance at the denominational offices of the Southern Baptist Convention, or, on the other end, the Episcopal Church in the USA?

Caputo leaves us with a question that's still alive when we finish: it is a haunting, prophetic question. And he convinces us that we will best serve Jesus's coming kingdom by never ceasing to ask the question.


