Hello Trinity! Ready or not, here come Advent and Christmas! This season, I invite you to take time to examine your life in the lens of your faith. As Socrates said, "The unexamined life is not worth living." Let's dive in! My prayer is that as we all move through the Advent season together, we will hear God whispering and guiding us into a new depth of relationship with God and with each other. I am going to help the process with two teaching resources. The first is a weekly devotional called, The Will to Dream. This devotional is designed to work through at your own pace alone, or with family and friends. I've found it to be an excellent resource and am looking forward to sharing it with you. We will place copies on the welcome tables for you. Here is a summary of what you will experience:

In this time of upheaval, trust can feel fragile. Truth is often contested. And the distance between us-whether physical, relational, or spiritual-can seem harder to cross. Many of us are carrying quiet questions and deep weariness. We long for something more than certainty-we long for healing, understanding, and hope. This ache isn't a weakness; it's a holy longing. A sacred desire for a world made whole.

The Will to Dream was created with this longing in mind. Whether you're engaging this resource on your own, with your family, or as part of a wider church community, it's here to help you pause, reflect, and reconnect with the radical hope at the heart of Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany. You'll explore the wisdom of the prophets, name what's broken, and imagine what could be. Feel free to adapt the materials in whatever way works best for your household-this resource is here to support you.

The second resource we will work through together. Beginning Tuesday, December 2<sup>nd</sup>, at 6pm we will gather in fellowship hall 1 and dive into an Advent study called Voices of Advent. This study is prepared by a Lutheran scholar who teaches at St. Paul Theological Seminary in St. Paul, MN. It is beautifully written and easy to enjoy for people of all faith experiences. Here is a summary of what we will study:

In "Voices of Advent," Matthew L. Skinner leads readers through biblical texts and explores how they shape our lives and Christmas celebrations. We listen as Jesus promises to return to us in the future, to John the Baptist as he prepares the way for the Messiah, to the faithful people and poets who anticipate the magnificence of Jesus' birth, and to the angels and visionaries who praise God when Christmas dawns. Listen carefully to the Bible's various perspectives that shape our preparations for Christmas; you'll hear hope in all of them. "Voices of Advent" helps readers experience Advent not only as the start of the Christian Church Year, but also as the powerful overture that sets the tone for the incredible story of Jesus.

We will have sign-up sheets at the welcome centers soon for ordering the book. I look forward to listening to the voices of Advent with you.

As we look toward Advent, our youth are hosting a Tater Tot Casserole Meal Fundraiser and selling Co-Conspirators with Christ t-shirts. Half of all proceeds will go toward purchasing Christmas presents for children in the care of St. Francis Ministries. The youth have set a big goal: to provide gifts for 90 students this year! 



### **Missions: Trinity Advent Christmas Project**

In 2011, Trinity started the Advent Christmas Project after a visit by several members to Ginghamsburg UMC outside of Dayton, Ohio. Mike Slaughter, the pastor of that mega-church had written an influential book, *Christmas Is Not Your Birthday: Experience the Joy of Living and Giving Like Jesus*, about his idea to celebrate Jesus' birthday in a meaningful way by giving Him a yearly birthday present, of which He would be very proud and delighted. In the book he relates how he had asked his congregation members to give a special mission fund at their church, an equal amount as they had spent on Christmas presents for all their family members. This plan was so successful that they continued it each Christmas.

After returning home and discussing this idea, AdCo decided to start by giving a tithe (10%) of our collected giving during the four Sundays of Advent every year plus any specific individual donations to a mercy mission project. Over the years we have funded:

- Circles of the Heartland
- Water wells in Africa
- A Fair Trade Market
- Houses for Haiti
- Freezers for the Salina Emergency Aid Food Bank
- To equip kitchens for both Ashby House and Salina Grace
- Child Advocacy and Parenting Services (CAPS)
- Love, Chloe Foundation
- Salina Rescue Mission
- Domestic Violence Association of Central Kansas (DVACK)
- Salina Shares
- Feed My Starving Children

Our Advent project this year, the new Boys & Girls Club of Salina, is an investment in Salina's youth! Every dollar invested in a club creates \$10.32 in economic benefits for youth, families and their community. When kids have access to after-school programs, they thrive. Young people learn to lead, serve, advocate and dream big. They find mentors, make friends and discover their purpose. Every dollar given towards our Boys & Girls Club endowment will be matched for operations by the Ted and Almita Augustine Fund. To reach this match of \$500,000, the money must be raised by December 31<sup>st</sup>. More information regarding how you can help will be coming in the following weeks.

### **Trinity Capital Campaign**

We finished the 7th quarter of our 12-quarter Trinity Capital Campaign to pay off the remaining \$1.2 million debt on our Family Life Center.

- Total Amount Pledged as of September 30, 2025 = \$926,640
- Total Payments made during the 3rd quarter of 2025 = \$40,868
- Grand total Payments & Pre-payments since August 1, 2023 = \$741,770
- Horizons Stewardship Fee paid from pledge pre-payments = \$46,042 (paid in full)
- Interest paid since January 1, 2024 = \$76,551
- Remaining Debt on the Family Life Center on September 30, 2025 = \$684,131
- Required monthly loan payment to First Bank Kansas = \$5,283 (66% interest & 34% principal)







