Hello, Trinity!

We enter this new year with two incredible new ministry opportunities. Trinity UMC is officially the first church to join the North Central Kansas Justice Organization. NCKJO is a non-profit collective of churches that includes many denominations. It is being financially supported with significant grants from the Great Plains UMC, and it sounds like the local Catholic synod will be heavily involved. Together we will assess the problems in our communities that we need to change to help people who have very limited resources. One of our sister organizations is called Topeka Jump. They have been able to secure \$3 million in funding to create a 30-bed emergency mental health care center. They received a \$600,000 grant to develop a violence reduction program and won state funding to open 131 new Oxford houses in Topeka. These are transitional living homes for people in recovery from addiction.

We are beginning to develop a leadership team here at Trinity to organize our involvement in the justice ministry. One of our congregation members came into my office this week and said, "Eric, our country is such a mess! I am being called to do something, but I don't know what to do!" I told her about the justice leadership team, and she immediately scheduled an appointment to meet with our organizers to discuss different levels of involvement. Perhaps you are feeling that call too. If so, my cell # is 479.426.8411, and my email is eric@triumc.org.

This past Thursday the advisory committee for the Core Communities program approved our budget, and we are now moving forward to hire a liaison who will help our advisory council raise the funds we need to run the program. We will probably launch in January of 2027. The Core Community of Saline County will work with up to 20 people who will participate in an 18-month session. They will be paired up with congregation members from local churches who will meet with them weekly for dinner, fellowship, and training. We will need volunteers to be mentors and will have at least four paid positions opening. The Community Liaison is the first of those positions. If you would love to raise money for an organization that has 18 successfully running communities and a 10-year track record of success, please contact me, and I will send the job description to you. The job will pay \$25 an hour for 15 hours a week.

God is moving in amazing ways in our community, and Trinity is at the center of that movement!

Update on the Meal Ministry

Did you know that TUMC has a freezer meal ministry?! Our goal is to provide folks with an easy meal in times of need (recovering from surgery, getting out of the hospital/rehab, new baby, etc.). Our volunteers bake small casseroles or cookies/desserts that can be easily frozen, and then we keep them in stock in the church freezer (in the kitchen by the Fellowship Halls). Then when congregation members are in need, we'll pull stock from the freezer, and a volunteer will deliver the meal to the recipient!

If you would like to contribute food or donations towards the meal ministry, OR know someone who could use a meal, please reach out to Pastor Chelsea! If you'd like to make some casseroles, we have small single-use foil pans (2 sizes) for you to use. These supplies can be found in the 'old' kitchen in a plastic tub by the hallway door. 

This year, the retreat will be April 16-17 at the **Homewood Suites** in Salina, Kansas.


