## A Letter from Pastor Eric

Dear Trinity:

As we conclude the second year of our Campus Connection internship ministry, I want to share some highlights with you. When we first imagined this program, our intention was to give students a way to build a résumé while earning some extra money working in a Christian environment. We quickly learned that this is the first job many of the students have had. We realized that we are also teaching them basic life skills they will need when applying for jobs after college. The students have also become family. Many of them have lunch dates with congregation members every Sunday. Some of our congregation members have brought our interns into their families by becoming host parents. Not only are the interns learning life skills, building résumés, and earning money, they are learning deep interpersonal or soft skills as they build relationships with the students they teach or the congregation members they work with and serve. We are producing a video that includes interviews with students and some of their parents giving testimony to how much this program has meant to them. I am looking forward to sharing this video with you soon!

We are learning quite a bit about the needs of our interns and how to care for and support them. They see this program as their support network. Many of them are from homes that are hundreds or thousands of miles away. The Campus Connection program has become their home away from home. To build upon this growing edge of the ministry, our administrator Kylee Gragg is enrolling in a program offered by the Center for Youth Ministry Training so she can better anticipate and meet the needs of these students and the children in our youth program.

Pastors Nick and Eric have been part of the Great Plains Conference Incubator program that inspired this ministry. Our coach is Paul Nixon, and he has said repeatedly that this is one of the most important ministries he has seen recently. He says that no church that he knows of has figured out how to build relationships with college students the way we have through this internship program. We have been invited to present the Campus Connection to the Sterling UMC, as they are hoping to begin a similar program with Sterling College.

The organ is a very complex musical instrument. The pipe organ is comprised of one or more sets of pipes, a wind system, one or more keyboards, and a system that connects these keys to the pipes (action). The pipes produce sound when pressurized air passes through them. Stops allow the organist to control which sets of pipes are on/off when a key is played (literally stops the sound).

#### **The Pipes**

Pipes are made of either metal or wood (and in some cases, both!). One pipe produces one pitch. There are typically 61 pipes in a set of pipes, called a rank. The timbre and volume of the pipe are controlled on how the wind is delivered to the pipe, how much wind is delivered, and the construction of the pipe.

There are two basic types of action (how the pipe is played), mechanical and electric action. Mechanical means each key is mechanically linked to each windchest (what the pipes sit on), and electric means that an electric signal from the keys are transmitted to the windchest to trigger the magnet to open the windway to the pipe.

There are two types of pipes (say that five times fast!), flues and reeds. A flue essentially works like a whistle. Reed pipes work like a clarinet or saxophone, with a metal reed vibrating against a metal block called a shallot.

Flues can be broken down into a few more categories, the Principals or Diapasons, the Flutes, and the Strings. Principals or Diapasons create a tone which is non-imitative. This is the organ sound that most people associate with the instrument. Flutes can be imitative or non-imitative. A Concert Flute sounds like the instrument used in a band or orchestra, while a Chimney Flute is a purely organ sound. Strings have a similar design to principals, but with thinner scales. Some sound thin and stringy, like a violin, while some have a fatter, deeper sound.

The reeds are also imitative and non-imitative. There are trumpets, oboes, clarinets, tubas, trombones, English and French horns (imitates an orchestra instrument), and also Waldhorns, Bombardes, and Cornopeans (organ-unique sounds). All have varying timbres and are lots of fun to explore when you have a variety. Some reeds are either chorus reeds, which blend into the musical ensemble (trumpet, clarion, bombarde), or solo reeds (used as solo voices against an ensemble), oboe, clarinet, tuba.

We will talk about the thing everyone can see – the organ console – in the next edition of the newsletter.
